Rules

The intention of Pines Travelling Gavel is to encourage visits between Lodges in the Province of Middlesex and the Masonic world.

The Travelling Gavel originated from Pines Lodge, Queensland Australia, which surrendered its warrant in June 2015. We are not aware of its previous travel history other than that it was rescued from East Barnet Lodge No.6259 by Fulcorn Lodge many years ago who has decided to adopt it and get it travelling & maintain a passport of its journey on their website

1. The Travelling Gavel will be presented, on demand, provided attendance of the visiting Lodge is of three members or more, current WM being one of them.
2. If two or more sister Lodges visit with the intention of rescuing the Travelling Gavel, and demand its surrender, the Master must comply but will surrender it to the visiting Lodge at his discretion.
3. Notwithstanding the above, visiting Lodges who are eligible through numbers to rescue the Gavel, but have rescued the Gavel in the previous 12 rolling months from the same Lodge, will forfeit that right to rescue for that visit, provided another Lodge or Lodges are in attendance and in sufficient numbers, and demand its surrender. If two or more eligible Lodges (i.e. they have sufficient numbers and have not previously rescued the Gavel from the same Lodge in the previous 12 months) and demand its surrender, rule 3 shall apply.
4. Rescuing Lodges must inform the Secretary of the Fulcorn Lodge No.4791 as soon as possible so that the Travelling Gavel whereabouts can be published on the Fulcorn Lodge website. Contact details can be found on the Lodge website www.fulcorn-4791.masonic-Lodge.org.uk . The rescuing Lodge must inform their Lodge name, number, date and location from which the Travelling Gavel was rescued in order that the Travelling Gavel Passport's permanent record is maintained.
Potential rescuing Lodges may visit the website to discover the present location of the Travelling Gavel.
5. The Travelling Gavel is intended for circulation throughout the World.
6. The Travelling Gavel remains the property of adopted owners, Fulcorn Lodge No. 4791 in the Province of Middlesex in the United Kingdom, and may be recalled at anytime. The call will not be done unreasonably, but if recalled, the current holders must ensure its safe return.
7. Intended rescuing Lodges must agree to the rules applicable to the Travelling Gavel and it is assumed that the Lodges rescuing the Travelling Gavel have undertaken to comply with the rules in full.
